

Eligibility for OAA Programs

Congregate Meals

- Age 60 or older and their spouses (regardless of age)
- May be eligible:
- Individuals under age 60 with disabilities who reside in housing facilities occupied primarily by the elderly or reside with and accompany an older individual.
- ∨Volunteers during meal hours.

Home Delivered Meals

- Age 60 or older and homebound
- May be eligible:
- ► Participant's spouse (regardless of age)
- Individuals under age 60 with disabilities if they reside at home with the older individual.



Home Delivered Meals and Decreased Healthcare Costs



Food Banks Serving Iowa

- Each are private non-profits
- Rely on donors
- Food safety
- Partner more than 1,200 agencies across Iowa
- >90% of donations go out in services
- Statewide more than **32 million meals** in 2019
- Very low cost
- per meal \$1 = avg 5.5 meals
- Rescue safe, edible, quality food that would otherwise be discarded
- ≥ 2019 14 million lbs. diverted from landfills


There will be over twice the number of people age 65 in 2040 vs. 2000

Changing Demographics



No senior should have to worry about running out of food.

- "We don't talk about it. It's embarrassing. I think the belief is, when your older and retired, you should have everything."
- "I only get \$708 a month to live on. Okay, I pay rent, I pay utilities, I buy my medicine, and what is left after that to buy groceries?"
- "We hide things. A few months ago my daughter was coming to town, so I went to the store and spent my entire month's food bill at once, filled my cupboards do she wouldn't know there was an issue."
- "When I go to the doctor, what's the first thing he says? Cut the bread, potatoes, crackers. Well, you just named the three things I get the most of."
- "I know there's food available. I know where I can get it for free. But I can't always get there."






Senior Food Insecurity



Nationally, the food insecurity rate among adults age 50-59 was 10.6% in 2018, meaning 4.5 million older adults were food insecure

LIVING WITH GRANDCHILDREN








Senior Food Insecurity

- Research is pre-Covid.
- ■5% 9.9 % of lowa seniors food insecure
- Food insecurity has increased 40% to 200% across the nation

Seniors are the fastest-growing group of workers in the country!








Increase in IDA Services Due to COVID-19

Food Bank Pandemic Impact

COVID19 Challenges

- Increase in unemployment
- More lowans in need of food
- Higher-income families in need of food
- Increased social distancing
- Uncertain food supply chains
- Reduced food rescue
- No contact distribution & food boxes
- Reduction in volunteers
- Senior congregate meal changes/needs/calls





Food Bank Pandemic Impact

COVID19 Response for Seniors

- Immediately identified need for seniors
- Connected with Iowa Dept. on Aging & Iocal AAA through Governors' office.
- Provided food boxes to AAA
- Increased amount of food per person
- Contactless food distributions

What's Next?

U of Iowa Food Bank Research with Iowa Dept of Public Health

- ► RE: Collaborations between Area Agencies on Aging and School sites with food banks to provide supplemental food delivered along with their home delivered meals or available for pick up at a congregate meal site or grandchild's school meals.
- ".... once a week they give you fresh produce, like potatoes, celery, onions, green peppers. It's real nice selections. I like that because I can cut some of that stuff up and I can freeze it, like green peppers, whatever, and then you can use it when you need it. So that's been good. I like that." (7.2.4)
- **Continue connecting and expanding partnerships! Food banks and AAA at the state and local community level.**
